

## **Student Carers**

In January 2024 the Office for Students added two groups of students with care responsibilities to their Equalities of Opportunity Risk Register: young carers and students with parental responsibilities. However, student carers form a broader group that includes young carers in school or in further or higher education, and higher education students with parental or other care responsibilities. The particular challenges that young carers and student carers may face include accessing a sufficiently wide variety of further or higher education opportunities, restricted access to academic, personal support and extra-curricular activities, increased cost pressures that may affect their course outcome and reduced opportunities to access further study or progress into employment that is reflective of their qualification levels.
